Description of Course

This semester students explain observable chemical processes in terms of changes in atomic structure, atomic rearrangement and mass. They explore how interactions within and between Earth's spheres affect the carbon cycle. Students develop an understanding of the role of publication and peer review in the development of scientific knowledge and the relationship between science, technologies and engineering. They have multiple opportunities to develop their skills in carrying out scientific investigations and communicating their ideas, findings and arguments to diverse audiences.

Learning Outcomes

- Explains how body systems provide a coordinated response to stimuli
- Describes how the processes of sexual and asexual reproduction enable survival of the species
- Analyses energy conservation in simple systems and applies wave and particle models to describe energy transfer
- Plans and conducts safe, reproducible investigations to test or identify relationships and models
- Selects and uses equipment to generate and record replicable data with precision
- Selects and constructs appropriate representations to organise, process and summarise data and information
- Analyses and connects data and information to identify and explain patterns, trends, relationships and anomalies
- Selects and uses content, language and text features effectively to achieve their purpose when communicating their ideas, findings and arguments to specific audiences
