Course Title: **10 Philosophy**

### Description of Course

This unit will give students an introduction to philosophy. Students will begin to master the art of abstract reasoning, learning how to think critically and defend their claims with confidence. The course will delve into the nature of reality by contrasting determinism, the view that all events are pre-determined, with the possibility of genuine free will. We'll also examine the puzzle of personal identity, pushing students to question what truly makes them who they are. By the end, students will not only think deeper but will navigate their own existence with a more profound and analytical perspective.

### Learning Outcomes

- Analyses the impact of assumptions and sources of error in methods and evaluates the validity of conclusions and claims
- Reads, views and comprehends a range of texts created to inform, influence and engage audiences
- Selects and experiments with text structures to organise, develop and link ideas and representations when writing and creating
- Evaluates the accuracy, usefulness and reliability of sources as evidence
- Constructs logical arguments based on analysis of a variety of evidence to support conclusions and evaluate claims

### Materials Required
